Sudoku is a number game currently popular in Japan, but originally invented by the eighteenth-century mathematician, Euler (pronounced Oiler).

The game consists of individual elements, boxes, rows, and columns.

The goal is to fill in the numbers so that each box, each row, and each column individually have unique numbers.

One way to work these puzzles is to find the boxes, rows, or columns with the most numbers already given. From there, a letter may be assigned to the unknown elements, for ease of tracking one's guesses. A process of elimination can be used, to eliminate what numbers cannot be used for the letter. By thinking about the box, row, and column, the answer can be found!
